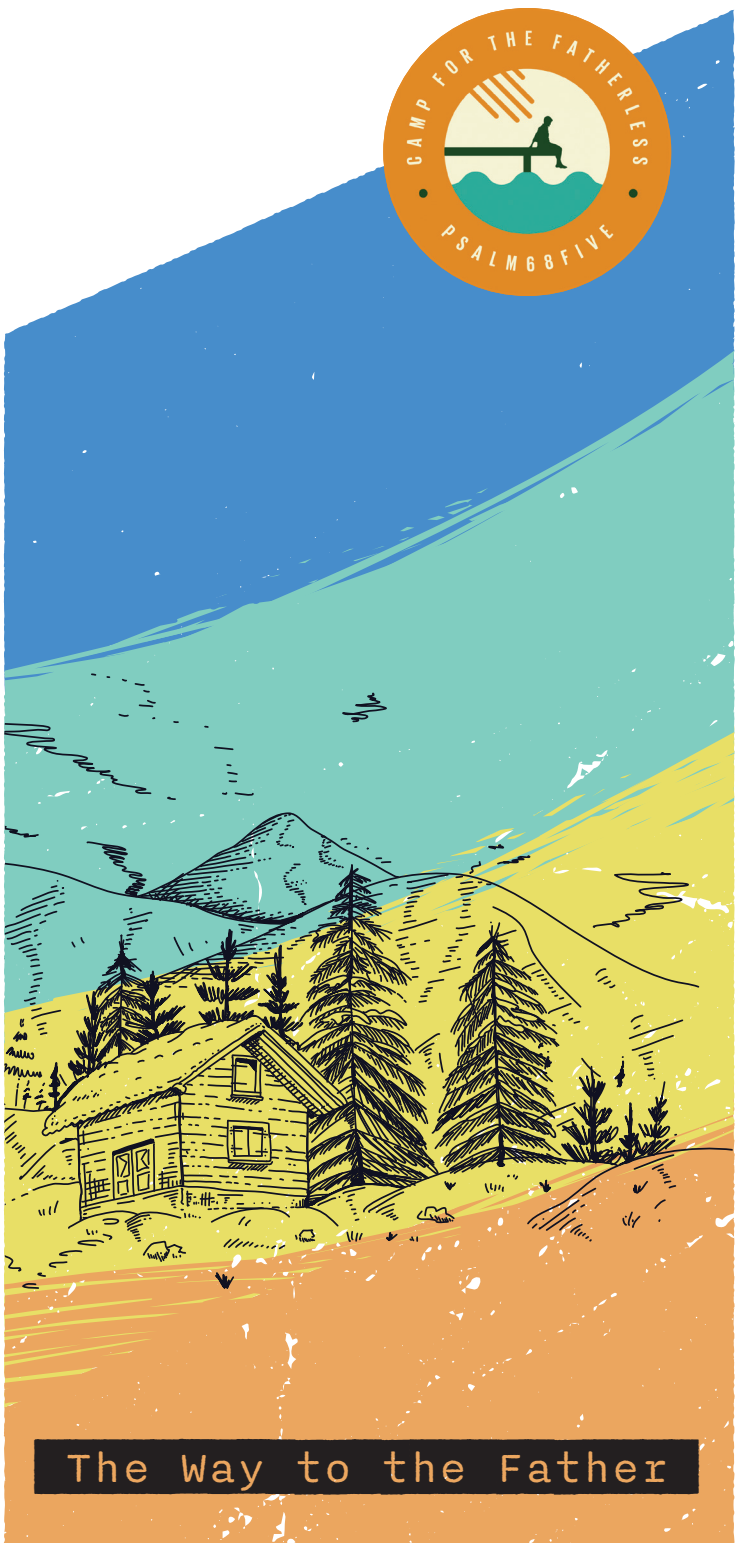

The Character of God the Father



STORY

Luke 15:11-24 ICB (paraphrase)

Then Jesus said, “A man had two sons. The younger son said to his father, ‘Give me my share of the property.’ So the father divided the property between his two sons. Then the younger son gathered up all that was his and left. He traveled far away to another country. There he wasted his money in foolish living. He spent everything that he had.

Soon after that, the land became very dry, and there was no rain. There was not enough food to eat anywhere in the country. The son was hungry and needed money. So he got a job with one of the citizens there. The man sent the son into the fields to feed pigs. The son was so hungry that he was willing to eat the food the pigs were eating. But no one gave him anything. The son realized that he had been very foolish. He thought, ‘All of my father’s servants have plenty of food. But I am here, almost dying with hunger. I will leave and return to my father. I’ll say to him: Father, I have sinned against God and against you. I am not good enough to be called your son. But let me be like one of your servants.’

So the son left and went to his father. While the son was still a long way off, his father saw him coming. He felt compassion for his son. So the father ran to him, and hugged and kissed him. The son said, ‘Father, I have sinned against God and against you. I am not good enough to be called your son. But the father said to his servants, ‘Hurry!

Bring the best clothes and put them on him. Also, put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get our fat calf and kill it. Then we can have a feast and celebrate! My son was dead, but now he is alive again! He was lost, but now he is found!’ So they began to celebrate.

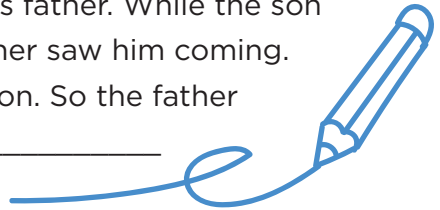

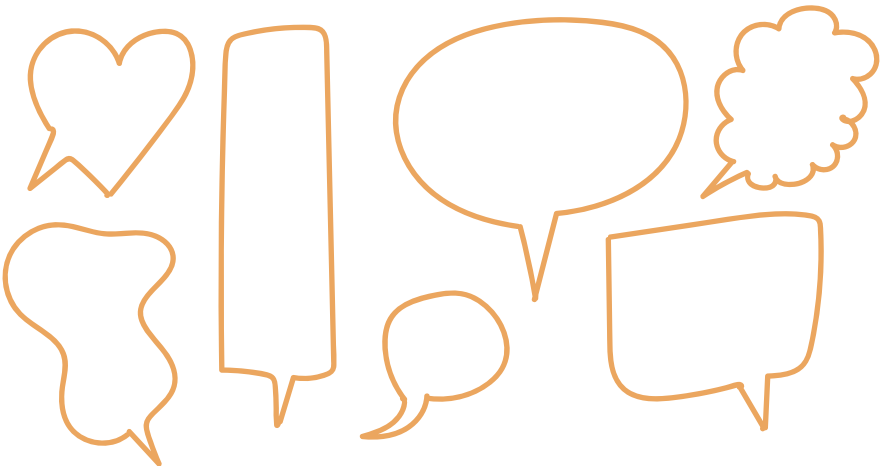

DAY 2

The Special Love of the Father to Certain Sons & Daughters

STORY

There once was a mother raising three children by herself. Her husband, the father of the children, had left the family several years before. The children were two boys (ages 9 and 10) and a girl (age 7). The mother was very tired from raising the children by herself and going to work everyday.

One night, the mother was at a women's bible study and someone told her about a Wednesday night youth group called AWANAS club. Her kids didn't really know any of the other kids who attended the group but they decided to give it a shot anyway.

When the children arrived at AWANAS club, they stood by themselves, just watching what was going on. Some men who were volunteering at the AWANAS club saw the children and asked each other if they knew who those three kids were and if anyone knew their father. When it was clear that no one knew whose kids they were, one of the men, DeShawn, went over to the kids, squatted down to talk to them and asked them who their dad was.

The oldest boy answered on behalf of his sister and brother. "We don't know where our dad is exactly...he had to leave us a long time ago when we were little."

DeShawn closed his eyes and whispered, “I’m sorry” to the kids and then walked back to the other men leaders of AWANAS club.

As the AWANAS club activities started, DeShawn thought about a sermon he had heard at church not that long ago. The sermon was on the scripture, Psalm 68:5, which said “A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy dwelling.”

DeShawn remembered that the Pastor had talked about how the Church should give special care for kids when they are growing up without a father around. DeShawn felt that God’s Holy Spirit was telling him to talk to those children and share that message.

A little later as the kids were having a snack break from the activities, Deshawn went over to them again, squatted down to their level and shared “Kids, I want you to know something special about God. Did you know that God the Father has a special place in His heart for kids when they are growing up without their earthly father around?” The kids weren’t sure how to answer that question but Deshawn confirmed “It’s true and it’s in the Bible!”

Although DeShawn did not share the exact scriptures, the message he was prompted to share found a place in the hearts of those children. They pondered what DeShawn shared with them for a long time until they finally came to understand the many scriptures in the Bible that reveal God’s loving and protective heart for kids growing up without an earthly dad around.

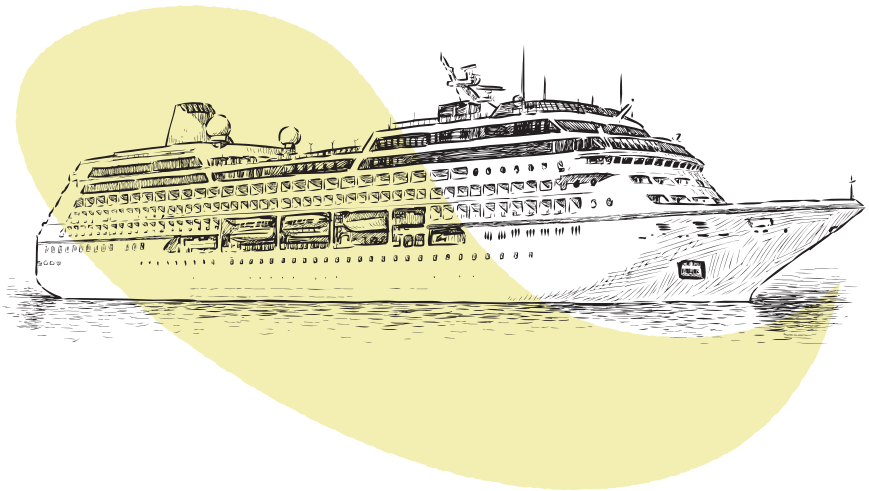

DAY 4

The farmer explained what had happened to the boy. When he finished explaining, the boy hopped up and grabbed the farmer's hand.

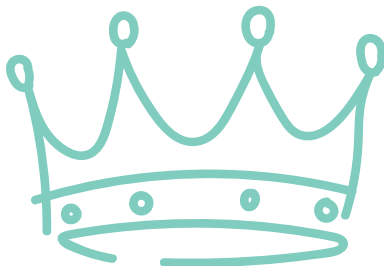
"You need to come with me," the boy said.



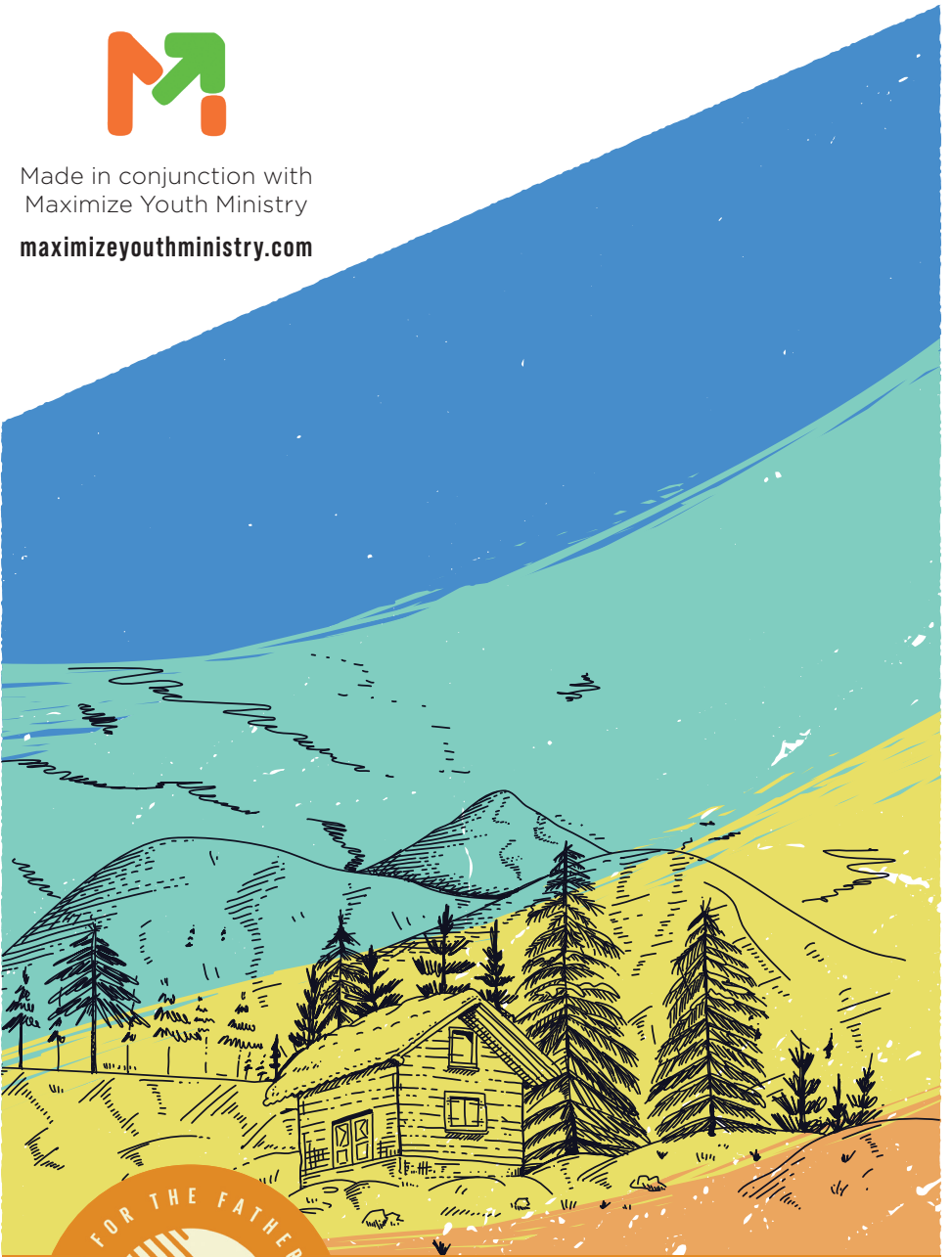
